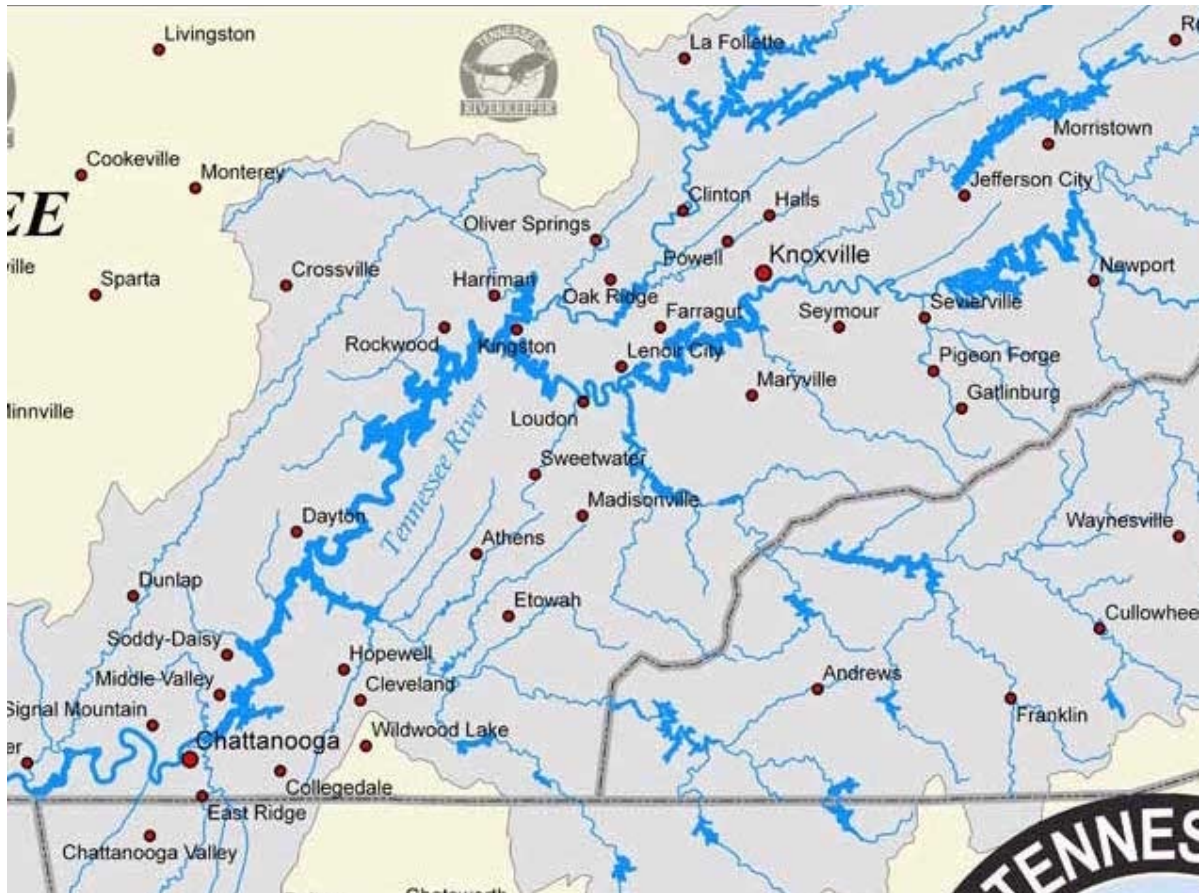




Questions for “Hold Onto Your Juice Box: The Three Rivers of Tennessee”
